#### **AFFILIATION & QUALIFICATIONS**

This show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes, whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the Constitution and Rules of the BSPS, including disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

All Rules as per the 2023 BSPS Rule & Show handbook, except for any new or amended rules as include in this schedule. All ponies must be four years old or over.

The following classes are qualifiers for the BSPS 2023 Winter Championship Show.

#### Winter worker Stakes

The highest placed 3 ponies will qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships together with the highest placed junior rider. Ponies may compete in more than one height section. Rider should be appropriate age on the day of the Show.

#### **Restricted W.H.P Classes**

#### RESTRICTED COMPETITORS MUST WEAR AN ARMBAND

Open & Restricted ponies no longer require qualification for the BSPS Winter Championships

#### **Rules for Restricted Classes**

Restricted open W.H.P.

Any pony that has been placed 1st to 8th at the RIHS(except pretty polly) or HOYS in 2021/2022/2023 is not eligible for the restricted qualification in the WHP classes

Restricted Open Heritage Mountain & Moorland W.H.P.

Any pony that has been placed 1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> in M&M W.H.P. classes at the RIHS or HOYS in 2021/2022/2023 is not eligible for the restricted qualification in the Heritage M&M W.H.P. Classes

#### Ages of riders of stallions

Riders must be 12 years old or over on 1st January in the current year to ride any pony stallion not exceeding 138cms or small breed M & M stallions i.e. Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland and Welsh section A & B

Riders must be 14 years old or over on 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current years to ride any pony stallion exceeding 138cms or large breed M & M stallions i.e. Connemara, Dales, Fells, Highland, New Forest, and Welsh C & D

Neither the BSPS or any of its officers, assistants or stewards shall in any way be responsible for any loss, injury or damages that may happen to exhibitors or their assistants or other members of the public, or to any animal or property or to any vehicle brought into the Showground or on any premises used in conjunction with the Show, or while entering or leaving the same.

It is necessary all exhibitors carry Public Liability Insurance for an adequate indemnity to protect against their negligence including any injury caused by their animals or property.

#### **BODY PROTECTORS**

Body Protectors <u>MUST</u> be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes including practice ring at B.S.P.S. Affiliated Shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organized and affiliated events.

A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" with the year 2009 (Purple) or 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label manufactured in the year 2009. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline. **All types of Air Jackets are not allowed.** 

#### **HATS**

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS 015 2011,VG1(BS) EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2016, AS/NZE 3838 2006 onwards. MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Hat Tagging in B.S.P.S. classes will be compulsory. (We are accepting British Eventing, British Riding Club and Pony Club tags).

**Class 1 Training stakes.** Animals 4yrs old or over Rider any age. Max height 40cms. Competitors will jump a course of fences. Halt, do a short show with a change of rein and gallop in the same ring

**Class 2 Training Stakes.** Animals 4yrs old and over. Rider any age Max height 50cms. Competitors will jump a course of fences. Halt, do a short show with a change of rein in the same ring.

## Judges: Miss P. Mallender & Mrs S Thomas.

**Class 3 Cradle Stakes** Mare or gelding 4 years old and over, not exceeding 122cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 11<sup>th</sup> birthday before 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year.

**Class 4 Nursery Stakes,** Mare or Gelding 4years old and over, not exceeding 133cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday before 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year.

Class 5 60cms Winter Worker Stakes. Plaited or Heritage Mountain & Moorland ponies 4yrs old or over, not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony /horse they ride. An Award Card For the highest placed child under 12yrs of age on 1st January in the current year in each class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.

Class 6 70cmsWinter Worker Stakes Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies, 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. An Award Card for the highest placed child under 14yrs of age on the day of the show in each class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.

Class 7 80cms Winter Worker Stakes Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies, 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. An Award Card for the highest placed child under 18yrs of age on the day of the show in each class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.

Class 8 90cms Winter Worker Stakes Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies, 4yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. An Award Card for the highest placed child under 18yrs of age on the day of the show in each class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.

Class 9 100cms Winter Worker Stakes Plaited or Heritage Mountain and Moorland ponies 4 yrs old and over not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. An Award Card for the highest placed child under 25yrs of age on the day of the show in each class who will also qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships.

\*\*Winter worker stakes, please note Ponies may compete in more than one height section. Rider should be appropriate age on the day of the Show. The highest placed 3 ponies will qualify for the B.S.P.S. Winter Championships together with the highest placed junior rider.\*\*

**Class 10 Training stakes.** Animals 4yrs old or over Ridder any age. Max height 50 cm. Competitors will jump a course of fences. Halt, do a short show with a change of rein and a gallop in the same ring.

Class 11 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Cradle Stakes Ponies 4 yrs old and over not exceeding 122cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 11<sup>th</sup> birthday before 1<sup>st</sup> Jan in the current year

Class 12 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Nursey Stakes Ponies 4 yrs old and over not exceeding 133cms. Suitable to be ridden by a rider not to have attained their 13th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year

Class 13 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Novice WHP Ponies 4 yrs old and over not exceeding 122cms. Riders any age. This class is not a Qualifier.

Class 14 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Novice WHP Ponies 4 yrs old and over exceeding 122cms but not exceeding 133cms. Riders any age. This class is not a Qualifier.

Class 15 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Novice WHP Ponies 4 yrs old and over exceeding 133cms and not exceeding 143cms, Riders any age. This class is not a Qualifier.

Class 16 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Novice WHP Ponies 4 yrs old and over exceeding 143cms, Riders any age. This is not a Qualifier.

Heritage Mountain & Moorland Novice WHP Championship 1st & 2<sup>nd</sup> in classes 13 to 16

Class 17 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Open (Restricted) WHP Ponies 4yrs old and over exceeding 143cms. Riders any age.

Class 18 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Open (Restricted) WHP Ponies 4yrs old and over exceeding 133cms. & not exceeding 143cms Riders any age

Class 19 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Open (Restricted) WHP Ponies 4yrs old and over exceeding 122cms. & not exceeding 133cms Riders any age

Class 20 The BSPS Heritage Mountain & Moorland Open (Restricted) WHP Ponies 4yrs old and over not exceeding 122cms. Riders any age.

Heritage Mountain & Moorland Open WHP Championship 1st & 2<sup>nd</sup> in classes 17 to 20

#### Health & Safety

The safety & security of persons and animals attending this show is of paramount importance to the organisers.

#### On the Day

Ponies may only be ridden on the showground in tack that is permissible in the show ring It is the responsibility of all competitors to be ready for their class on time
